## CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) INFORMATION

### City of Southlake Response to COVID-19 Virus

The City of Southlake is currently operating at what's known as a level two emergency activation in reaction to the spread of the COVID-19 virus. The activation means the City's Executive Leadership Team and selected support staff are actively managing the local situation on a daily basis to ensure the protection of the public health and safety while also endeavoring to continue to provide essential services supported by useful, relevant information about the evolving circumstances.

#### City Offices Closed to the Public

With City offices closed to the public, City staff is working with vendors and customers through online means such as phone meetings and conference calls, online payment options, and other online services. First responders are using protective gear as prescribed on emergency medical calls and during police interactions that require physical contact. Customer and business trash and recycling collection are running on its regular schedule.

- All Volunteer Southlake opportunities/assignments.
